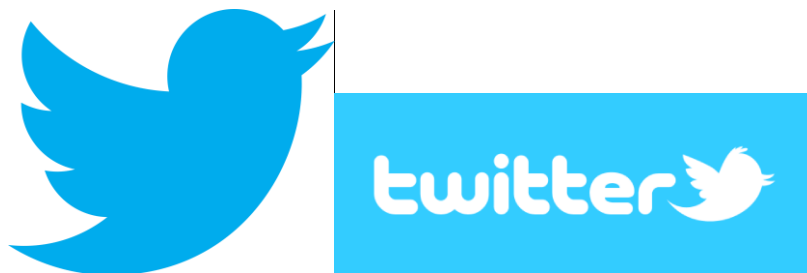

Butterflies - collaborating, parent / carers and sewing



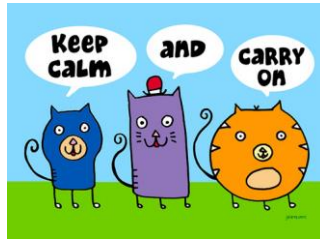
