


Key information

Riot Act is a theatre company who came into the school to teach Year 6 all about road safety as most of children will be making their own way to and from secondary school next year. It was a very informative session. The children walked into the hall and they were in the middle of the scene of an accident, where a Year 7 boy had been hit by a car and died. They became investigators and had to question any witnesses and document any evidence they saw.

We found out Lee (the boy who died) had been hit by a car at a zebra crossing; however he had been wearing headphones, his hood was up, blocking his vision and he was playing on his phone. He stepped out so quickly that the driver didn't see him.
