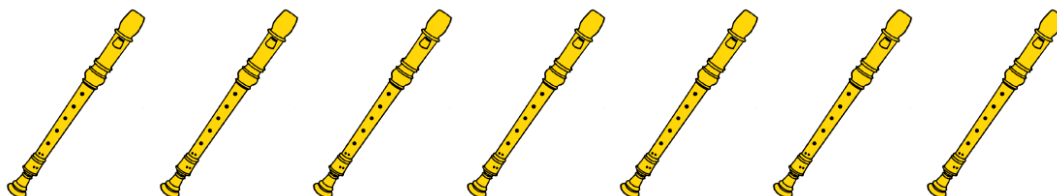


My name is Fred. I'm the 4R school councillor. I really want to add more football pitches and make sure everyone has something to do.
