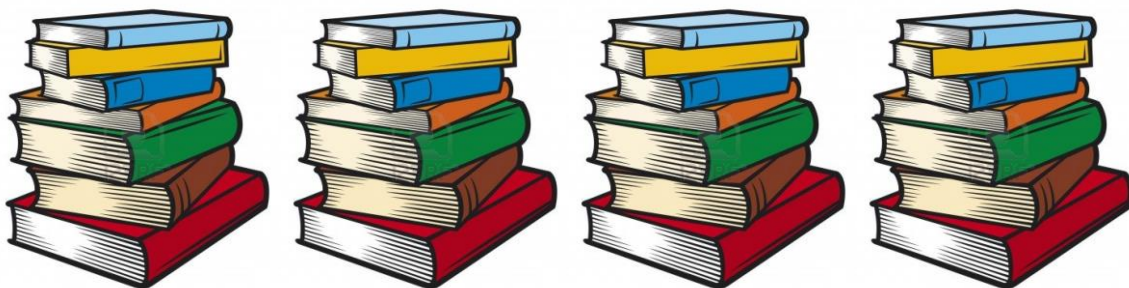


Table cloths for reading cafes
