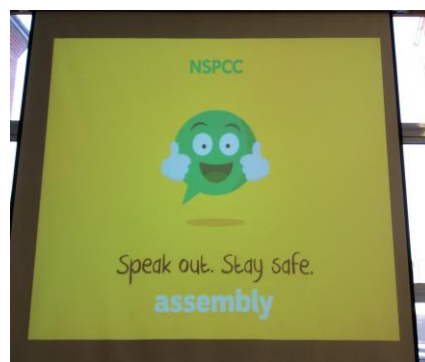

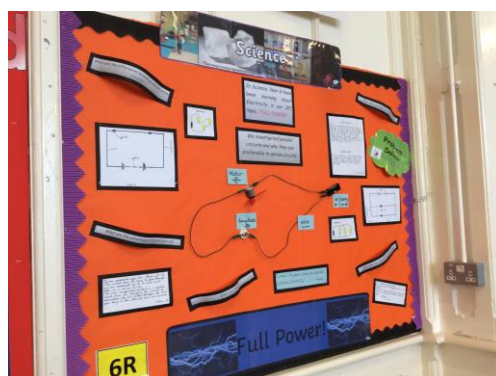


Clubs corner
